VILLAGE UPDATE

As we move from the Fall season into Winter the Village Employees have been busy wrapping up projects and preparing for wintry weather. The trucks have been maintenanced and equipment upgraded as well as getting our salt bins full and plenty of ice control grit so we are prepared to fight the battles ahead that Winter brings to the Village. We will soon be saying good bye to Mike Roe and Greg Hunter both long time employees of the Street Department as they retire the first of the year. We wish them well and thank them for their service to the Village for so many years.

The Slope Creek Waterline Project is in full construction with anticipated completion in June of 2023. Rudzik Excavating has been doing a great job on the project and have been communicating well with land owners and officials.

The Westview Drive Sewage Lift Station and Force Main Replacement Project was awarded to Ohio-WV Excavating with construction expected to begin by the end of December and completed by Spring.

The Intersection Safety Improvements Project is now complete at the intersections of Chestnut & Main as well as South Street & S. Chestnut. This project was completely funded with no cost to the Village through the Governor's Office by gas tax funds. The Village will have the benefit of mast arms to hold the traffic lights rather than cables and received all new traffic lights and controls separating the two intersections. The new system features walk lights also. There is also a radar function that when traffic is slow in the night the lights will favor St. Rt. 800 traffic and only turn to red if a vehicle is stopped at the light on the intersecting street. This will be a huge improvement for the community.

The Village is currently working with ODOT on the Tunnel & Trail Project. The Village has been awarded 2.1 million dollars for this project to provide drainage and a liner for the tunnel complete with lighting as well as wing walls for bank stabilization and a paved walkway from South Street to St. Rt. 147 along Railroad Street.

We have finally received funding through a 65% grant from FEMA through ODNR Dam Safety Division to repair the slip on the Rotary Lake at Barnesville Memorial Park. Based on estimates this grant is worth an estimated \$350,000 to our community and will assist in preserving our recreational lake that is enjoyed by many.

Village officials continue to work on revitalization projects in our downtown as well as in the park and are currently applying for grant funds through the Community Appalachian Grant Funds Program that has recently been released.

We are looking forward to much success and even more projects in 2023.

Don't Fall Victim to Scams - Just Hang Up

Year round, residents should be cautious of on-going scams and should be careful not to fall victim to them. The holiday season seems to be a general time for an uptick in scams. Scammers will use all kinds of tactics to gain information such as personal and financial information from you. Never provide financial or personal information to them. Simply just hang up if you feel like you are talking with a scam caller. On going scams that have been reported to the Police Department include: IRS Scam, Gift Card or Money Card scams, Donation Requests for the Police or Sheriff Department Scam (The Police Department and Sheriff Department does not ask for donations). These are a few circulating the Barnesville area. Scams can be reported to the Police by calling 740-425-1976 or reported to Ohio Attorney General Office online www.OhioAttorneyGeneral.gov or by phone 800-282-0515.

Fall Leaf Pickup

The Barnesville Public Works will be picking up leaves that are left curbside by residents of the Village of Barnesville, as long as they are contained in paper biodegradable compostable bags. No plastic trash bags will be accepted. Bags must contain leaves only and will be picked up as time allows. No specific schedule will be followed. The collection will begin Oct. 15 and will end Dec. 15. Also, there is no longer a drop-off point at the Depot, and will be a dumping violation if found dropping off there.

※Winter is Here ※

- Snow Removal: Please do not shovel or plow snow into the roadway or onto neighboring properties without permission from the property owner. Sidewalks must be kept free of snow and ice. Please do your part and remember to shovel your sidewalks this winter.
- No parking in the downtown area if snowfall exceeds three inches or greater, to allow for the downtown streets to be plowed.
- Use caution when driving during snowfall and this winter as roads could be slick. Always remember your headlights during rain, snow & fog to create better visibility.

- Do your part and help public works by keeping roadways clear and allow room for the plows to move through.
- Off Road vehicles including ATV's, 4-wheelers, and snowmobiles cannot be operated on the public streets, even if under a snow level or snow emergency.
- During snow/ice events village crews will be working diligently to ensure that roads are clear, please be patient as crews treat and plow the roadways.

Barnesville to Test the CodeRED Community Notification System

The Village of Barnesville Emergency Notification System, CodeRED, will be tested on Wednesday, March 1, 2023 to validate telephone numbers in the CodeRED's database. The CodeRED system is provided to Barnesville through Belmont County 911. Here's what you need to know:

- There is no need to take action if you receive the call. Emergency personnel
 are merely testing the system to ensure it is operational as needed, and to
 encourage additional residents to enroll to receive future notifications.
- This process helps us continually improve the system. Testing increases the
 efficiency of the system and speed at which notifications will be delivered during
 an actual emergency.
- Visit our website to update contact information. If your phone number is not in the database, you will not receive a call when we do launch an important notification.

Residents and businesses are encouraged to visit our website and update their contact information, in particular those individuals who have unlisted phone numbers, who have changed their phone number or address within the past year and those who use a cellular phone or VoIP phone as their primary number. The more residents who actively add or update their contact information in the emergency database, the better able we are to protect people and property.

The CodeRED system allows Village of Barnesville and Belmont County officials to effectively reach residents and personnel by using the system's capabilities to send telephone calls, text messages, emails and social media posts to inform residents and better protect life and property.

Help Us Help You!

In an emergency, First Responders need to quickly identify where your home is located. This becomes a challenge when the address number is not clearly displayed on your home and mailbox.

Your house should have the address number displayed with large numbers, a minimum of 4 inches tall. These numbers should be clearly visible from the street.







Your mailbox should have the address number visible using reflective numbers, on both sides of the mailbox.





Having your home clearly identified will save valuable time in an emergency.
