# **VILLAGE UPDATE**

Summer has arrived and the Barnesville Memorial Park is lively with activity. We had some difficulty in opening the pool that delayed opening day for 5 days but the pool is open and in operation now.

The annual Independence Day Celebration will take place on Saturday July 1st with a rain date of Saturday July 8th. This event always proves to be a good time and a great community gathering. The Village continues to work with ODOT on the Tunnel & Trail Project. The Village has been awarded 2.1 million dollars for this project to provide drainage and a liner for the tunnel complete with lighting as well as wing walls for bank stabilization and a paved walkway from South Street to St. Rt. 147 along Railroad Street.

### Permit Parking Spaces Available

The Village of Barnesville has several permit parking spaces available in the East Main Street Parking Lot, located between Cheffy's and Avenues. The cost is \$20 a month or \$120 a year. Parking permits are valid Monday through Saturday 8am-6pm, except special events and for maintenance. Permits are sold on a first come basis. ### Fire Hydrant Flushing

The Barnesville Water Department will be flushing fire hydrants beginning Monday, July 10, 2023 and will continue daily until completed. Residents may experience loss of pressure and discolored water and should inspect the water prior to washing clothing as staining may result. The Barnesville Water Department apologizes for any inconvenience this may create.

#### **Pool Water Meter Available**

The Barnesville Water Department has a water meter available for those that are filling their pools up. This meter can be obtained from the Water Office Monday-Friday 8am-4pm. ### Spring-Summer Street Sweeping

The Village Street Department is sweeping streets now that weather has improved. Be on the lookout for flyers that will be placed on cars for no parking daysto allow street sweeping to begin on your street.

### Sidewalk Replacement Loan

Barnesville Village Council is offering a loan program to residents in an effort to replace deteriorated sidewalks. The program offers zero percent loans to replace the walks that travel parallel with Village streets and will include curbs and driveway aprons. The village will select and pay the contractor and then send a monthly invoice to the property owner. All rules, regulations, and specifications of the village will be followed. Applicants must have not had any delinquent water bills over the past 24 months, unpaid Village Income taxes, or unpaid fines. # "Petiquette"

505.01 Dogs and Other Animals Running at Large.

No owner can allow a dog to run at large. All dogs must be on a leash when they are being walked.

#### 505.09 Barking or Howling Dogs.

No person shall keep or harbor any dog within the Municipality which, by frequent and habitual barking, howling or yelping, creates unreasonably loud and disturbing noises of such a character, intensity and duration as to disturb the peace, quiet and good order of the Municipality.

#### Please Clean Up After Your Pet.

A dog owner shall be responsible for the immediate removal and proper disposal of his/her dog's feces. Proper disposal shall consist of placing the feces in a wrapper and using a trash receptacle.



# **CodeRED Test Survey**

We appreciate everyone that completed the CodeRED Test Survey. We have had a lot of good responses to the survey and also responses on social media.

The Police Department has been in contact with CodeRED to work out some trouble areas that did not get the message due to mapping issues with our Corporation Limit. This mapping issue has been corrected to reflect our actual corporation limit, instead of the default mapping corporation line. This will ensure that all residents of the corporation will receive messages when they are sent out by the Police Department.

In addition to the corporation limit issue, we now have the ability to send messages out to those within the Barnesville Water Department Service Area. This will ensure boil orders are sent out by the Village of Barnesville when necessary. Previously these were sent to Belmont County 911 to be sent via CodeRED, as the Police Department did not have access

outside of the Barnesville Corporation Limit. This will ensure information is relayed in a timely manner. Water Customers information will be entered into CodeRED to allow us to reach all water customers. Many received a double CodeRED notification. There was an issue when sending that caused this. However, this issue has been corrected.

Based on those that responded to the survey it seems everyone was appreciative of the CodeRED test. We will continue to do an annual CodeRED Test on March 1st at 1:00 PM each year, with a survey to follow each time.

Those that are signed up for CodeRED we appreciate your participation in this free Emergency/General Alert System. We encourage residents of Barnesville and Belmont County to enroll in the CodeRED notification system. To enroll visit www.alerts.barnesvilleohio.com or text "BELMONT" to 99411. The CodeRED system is provided to the Village of Barnesville through Belmont County 911.

# Code RED Barnesville Water Customers

The Village of Barnesville Water Customers have been added to the CodeRED system. This will ensure all customers receive a CodeRED notification for Boil Orders when they are issued. This notification can now go out to those that not only reside within the corporation limit, but now will also include those outside of the corporation limit that have Barnesville Water Service. Customers have only been opt-in as phone call. If you prefer a text message notification or email you may update your preference by visiting: www.alerts.barnesvilleohio.com and click on "Register for CodeRED". You may also text "BELMONT" to 99411. If you would like to Opt-Out of being apart of CodeRED you may opt-out by following the above directions.

Smoke from the Canadian Wildfires has been entering our area causing air quality issues Below is information about Wildfire Smoke.



Wildfire smoke creates tiny particles in the air that can cause health concerns.

BUILDING MAINTENANCE: All buildings storage, houses, trailers should be weather resistant tight, free from excessive peeling or any deterorating conditions such as cracks, holes, broken glass that may admit rain, cold air, dampness, rodents, and insects.

FENCES OR RETAINING WALLS: Must be structurally sound and not deteriorating, must not have loose or leaning elements.

MAINTENANCE OF PREMESIS: Each and every premesis shall be kept free of all nuisances, health, safety, and fire hazards, unsanitary conditions, and infestation. It shall be the duty of the responsible party to keep the premesis free of said conditions and to promptly remove and abate the same.



VEHICLES: Must have current & updated registration and tags. Must be eqquipped with all parts required to legally operate safetly on the roadway.



WEEDS OR HIGH GRASS: Cannot grow to

JUNK &/OR INOPERABLE VEHICLES: Must be stored within a fully enclosed building or other location not exposed to public view, or shall be removed from the premesis.

The exterior of every premises and structure shall be maintained in good repair, to the end that the premises and each structure thereon will be preserved; adjoining properties protected from blighting influences; and safety and fire hazards eliminated

TRASH, JUNK, DEBRIS: Such items are prohibitted from being left on your property for extended periods of time. They must be properly disposed of.

Properties that are in violation of the Village Property Maintenance Code 1381 are given a notice to abate. This notice provides the property owner 30-days to correct the violation. After 30-days property owners will be summonsed to appear in Mayor's Court and may be penalized \$100 per day for each day the violation(s) continue after the abatement has expired.
