VILLAGE UPDATE

The Fall Season seems to have approached so quickly this year. The Village is trying to wrap up 2023 projects before old man winter arrives. The Park Crew is busy closing up the pool and preparing for the cooler season. The mowing crew has been decorating and hanging flags for the Shamrocks as well as the Pumpkin Festival.

The Slope Creek Waterline Project is nearing the end of construction with plans for start-up of the pump house in October. This will allow us to provide additional flow to the water treatment facility and secure our future for the next 60 years.

Village Officials are working with ODOT on the Tunnel Rehabilitation and Trail Project that will travel along Railroad Street and the former B & O rail right of way. The tunnel will receive a liner with wing walls to be built on each side to protect from slippage as well as stabilization and drainage of the tunnel. This should prove to be an enjoyable and shady place to exercise once completed. This is nearly a 3 million dollar project with the Village only having \$100,000 of local funds in it. A gift to the community.

ODNR in cooperation with FEMA has funded the much-needed slip repairs to the Rotary Lake at the Barnesville Municipal Park. There is a possibility of the project beginning yet this fall but if not then definitely in the Spring of 2024.

Barnesville Public works along with Warren Township employees will be paving some alleys and our Fall leaf pickup will soon begin with the anticipated start date of October 15th and continuing to December 15th based on weather conditions. The leafs must be placed in the paper biodegradable compostable bags and left curbside. No particular route is followed and they will be picked up as time allows.

Fall Leaf Pickup

The Barnesville Public Works will be picking up leaves that are left curbside by residents of the Village of Barnesville, as long as they are contained in paper biodegradable compostable bags. No plastic trash bags will be accepted. Bags must contain leaves only and will be picked up as time allows. No specific schedule will be followed. The collection will begin Oct. 15 and will end Dec. 15, Also, there is no longer a drop-off point at the Depot, and will be a dumping violation if found dropping off there.

Barnesville PD Key Holder Registry

The Barnesville Police Department is working on updating key holder records in order to improve response to alarm drops, open doors, etc. We encourage businesses with or without alarms to register and residents with alarm systems to register key holder information with our department which will assist us when responding to an emergency at your business or residence. All information is confidential and is only used in case of an emergency at your business or alarm drop at your residence. If at any point your key holder or information changes we urge you to submit an updated form. Permit Parking Spaces Available

The Village of Barnesville has several permit parking spaces available in the East Main Street Parking Lot, located between Cheffy's and Avenues. The cost is \$20 a month or \$120 a year. Parking permits are valid Monday through Saturday 8am-6pm, except special events and for maintenance. Permits are sold on a first come basis. Make sure your house number can be seen from the road.

Clearly display your house number so emergency responders can quickly find you. Barnesville Ordinance Chapter 1371 requires that the owners and each adult occupant of all houses, apartments or other residences located within the Village of Barnesville shall post the street number of said house, apartment or other residence at some conspicuous place on the building or grounds. Said number shall be of surficient size so as to be visible from the street. Anyone failing to comply may be fined a sum not exceeding fifty dollars (\$50,00). Each day of Making sure your house numbers can be seen helps first responders find your location easile.

Beware of Scams

Regularly, the Barnesville Police Department receives calls from the public wanting to report a scam or inquiring if something may be a scam. We want to remind the community to watch out for signs of a scam. Not only should you be watching out for yourself but watching out for vulnerable loved ones in your life. Ongoing scams that have been reported to the department include: IRS Scam, Warrant Scam, Money Card Scam, as well as many others. There is a countlies amount of scenarios that scammers can use to try and pry information out of you.

Always remember:

- Never provide your personal or financial information to an unsolicited caller or email.
- 2. Scammers usually try to create a sense of urgency. Slow down to truly understand what is being requested and by whom.
- 3. Be suspicious of callers who demand immediate payment for any reason.
- 3. Never wire money or provide a stranger with debit or credit card numbers.
- 4. Verify, verify, verify!

Staying Connected Program

The Ohio Department of Aging has a free daily calling service for Ohioans age 60 and older. This program is called "Staying Connected." The program will call older adults who sign up for the service during predetermined window of time. When participants answer the phone, they will be asked to respond via

touch-tone to confirm they are OK or to access live support. If no one answers after three attempts, a call will then be made to an alternate contact (if provided) or to non-emergency services. The service can be canceled at any time. These free check-in calls are made between 7am-6pm daily. During sign-up you choose the time that best suits you and your loved one. You can place a hold on these calls at any time. Those wishing to participate must be an Ohio Resident age 60+ and who have a valid phone number and provide an alternate contact (preferred but not required). 5 STEPS FOR SAFE DIGGING

Working on an outdoor project? Always call 8-1-1 first, because you never know what's below. Here are five easy steps for safe digging:

1. NOTIFY

Call 8-1-1 or make a request online two to three days



2. WAIT

Wait two to three days for a response to your request. Affected utilities will send a locator to mark any underground



Confirm that all affected utilities have responded by comparing the markers to the list of utilities the 8-1-1 call center notified.



3. CONFIRM 4. RESPECT

Respect the markers provided by the affected utilities. They are your guide for the duration of your project.

5. DIG CAREFULLY If you can't avoid

digging near the markers (within 18-24 inches on all sides, depending on state laws), consider moving your project.





Golf Cart Operation

Due to a number of complaints regarding golf cart operations we would like to remind those operating them within the Village of Barnesville Coproration Limits:



- Drivers of a golf cart must have a valid driver's license.
- No person less than 16 years of age should operate a golf cart.
- No Person shall operate a golf cart on the street within the
 - Village unless the golf cart has been inspected.
- Do not drink and drive.
- Must obey all traffic laws during operation (No U-Turns).
- Must obey all traffic laws during operation (No U-Turns).
 No person shall operate a golf cart on any public roadway that is 35 mph or greater, except when crossing such roadway. Crossing means directly from point A to point B.
- Occupants of a golf cart should be seated at all times on the seat and buckled up by a seat belt when in motion. Standing on the golf cart while in motion is prohibited.
 - golf cart while in motion is prohibited.

 Golf carts are not permitted to be driven on the sidewalk.

 Operation of a golf cart shall be permitted between April 1st



through October 31st each year.

Parking Time Limits & Reminders



The Barnesville Police Department have recieved increased parking complaints in the downtown area from business owners, employees and their customers. We want drivers to be aware that on street parking is restricted during the day to 2 hours only in certain zones downtown, unless otherwise marked (ORD 351.14 passed 12-7-81). 2 hour parking is from 9am-5pm on any day except on Sundays and legal holidays.

2 Hour Parking Area Includes (unless otherwise posted):

- · East Main Street from S Lincoln to Chestnut St (Square)
- West Main St from Chestnut St (Square) to Gardner St
 North Chestnut St from Walnut St to Main St (Square)
- South Chestnut St from Main St (Square) to South St

Additional Parking Restrictions:



- North Arch St Handicap spot in front of municipal building is 30-min parking
 In order to facilitate vehiclular access to and from the Barnesville Elementary School, parking on West Church Street between North Chestnut Street and North Broadway is prohibited on School Days between the hous of 7am-4cm. (ORD 35117 passed
- 12-10-18)
 Please pay attention to no parking areas and loading zones throughout the
 - No Parking Fridays between 3am-7am (Street Sweep Day) on North Arch St from Church st to East Main St, East Main St from square to henderson st, West Main st from Square to Gardner St, North Chestnut St from Square to Cherry St, and South Chestnut St from Square to Mill St.

Drivers will now see new signs throughout this area. By parking downtown, drivers will consent to the enforcement of time limits, including the chalking of tires and other enforcement means. We want drivers to be aware of the parking regulations the Village has in place.

Other parking reminders within the Village of Barnesville:

- Street parking is public parking and is first come, first serve.
 Residents are not entitled to parking space out front of their homes on the public street, this is public parking.
- Objects cannot be placed in the roadway to block a parking space.
 Parking lots within the Village of Barnesville do not have a 2 hour time limit.

Sidewalk Replacement Loan Program

Barnesville Village Council is offering a loan program to residents in an effort to replace deteriorated sidewalks. The program offers zero percent loans to replace the walks that travel parallel with Village streets and will include curbs and driveway aprons. The village will select and pay the contractor and then send a monthly invoice to the property owner. All rules, regulations, and specifications of the village will be followed. Applicants must have not had any delinquent water bills over the past 24, months, unpaid Village income taxes, or unpaid fines. Ohio Outdoor Fire Laws: What You Need to Know

Ohio Revised Code 1503.18 Regarding Kindled Fires

O.R.C. 1503.18 is under the authority of the Ohio Division of Forestry.

This law prohibits outdoor open burning statewide in

unincorporated areas during the months of March, April, May, October, and November between the hours of 6 a.m. and 6 p.m.

This ban includes burning of yard waste, trash, and debris, even in a proper burn barrel.

During spring, wildfire danger is high before plants have turned green, and in fall, fire danger is high due to abundant dry leaves and dead grass. Warm, windy tweather in both seasons also contribute to elevated fire risk. Alvays be sure to use a proper burn barrel when burning outdoors during leavel brewer.

 Materials NEVER to be burned at any time or any place in Ohio:
 - atenais NEVER
 - Dead Animals
 Materials containing rubber, grease, asphalt, or made from petroleum

OTHER RESTRICTIONS

- Fires must be more than 1,000 feet from neighbor's inhabited building
- No burning when air pollution alert, warning, or emergency is in effect
 Fire/smoke cannot obscure visibility on roadway, railways, or airfields.
- No burning within village or city limits or restricted areas



KEY HOLDER REGISTRY

This registry allows police to quickly access vital contact information for key holders for your home or business during alarm drops. Business owners with or without alarms are encouraged to register. Residents with alarms are also encouraged to register your information. Be sure if changes need made to your registry.
