a. Aaron Wildman discussed with Council security cameras at the Depot due to ongoing vandalism. He presented an estimate from Chris Baker for \$16,716.68. The estimate would provide full coverage from the tunnel face to the gate that would cover both sides of the depot and pavilion. Offering full coverage of the scope of the whole area of the depot grounds with the Rails to Trails being considered. A lengthy discussion was held. Mr. Wildman stated the Depot Committee doesn't have the funds and no tenants due to the roof leaking. He is awaiting an estimate for the roof from Durable Slate. Council discussed the cameras and repairing the roof. Councilman Mr. McKelvey stated he supported the roof repairs over the cameras. Mr. Hill stated get the cameras going and to look into grants available to redo the roof. Chief Sirianni and Mr. Wildman, along with any Councilman that is available, to meet with Mr. Baker to discuss the compatibility of new cameras to add to our existing camera system.

b. Councilman Brian Yarnall asked Mr. Deal to explain the gas leak and when the gas was shut off to the properties on North Chestnut Street. Mr. Deal stated the gas was requested to be abandoned from the buildings over two years ago. Columbia Gas had all three buildings listed as abandoned, however the vet office was not. Mr. Yarnall stated so really it was their responsibility that it should have been shut off, so if any Business would want to submit a claim, it would be with Columbia Gas and Mr. Deal confirmed.
