### **VILLAGE UPDATE**

The Winter Season seems to be approaching as fast as this year has gone. The Village Departments have been preparing for the colder weather and what may come. Road salt and ice control grit have been stock piled and the maintenance provided to the trucks and equipment and they are ready to go for snow and ice removal. The park is winterized.

The downtown demo project has just been completed with local developer T. J. Jefferis planning to bring some new construction to that area soon.

The Slope Creek Waterline Project is complete with final adjustments being made to the pump house. This will allow us to provide additional flow to the water treatment facility and secure our future for the next 60 years.

Fall leaf pickup will continue until December 15th based on weather conditions. The leaves must be placed in the paper biodegradable compostable bags.

The CHRISTmas tree pickup will continue until January 12th, 2024 when left curbside by residents and will be picked up as time allows with no particular schedule or route.



Ohio BCI and FBI database checks are offered as well as Florida Level 2 Background checks, Fingerprint Capture, and Fingerprint Cards. ### Annual CodeRED Test March 1, 2024 at 1 PM

The Village of Barnesville will be sending out the annual test of the emergency alert system CodeRED on Friday, March 1, 2024 at 1:00 PM. Subscribers will receive a test alert by phone call, text, and email. This allows us to ensure the system is operational. ### **Fall Leaf Pickup**

The Barnesville Public Works will be picking up leaves that are left curbside by residents of the Village of Barnesville, as long as they are contained in paper biodegradable compostable bags. No plastic trash bags will be accepted. Bags must contain leaves only and will be picked up as time allows. No specific schedule will be followed. The collection will begin Oct. 15 and will end Dec. 15. Also, there is no longer a drop-off point at the Depot, and will be a dumping violation if found dropping off there.




- Please do not shovel or plow snow into the roadway or onto neighboring properties without permission from the property owner.
- Sidewalks must be kept free of snow and ice. Please do your part and remember to shovel your sidewalks this winter. Property owners are responsible for the maintenance and upkeep of their sidewalks during the winter and year round.
- Use caution when driving during snowfall and this winter as roads could be slick. Always remember your headlights during rain, snow & fog to create better visibility.
- No parking in the downtown area if snowfall exceeds three inches or greater, to allow for the downtown streets to be plowed.

- Do not leave your vehicle running unattended with keys inside it to heat up. Doing so creates the perfect opportunity for the vehicle to be stolen.
- Do your part and help public works by keeping the roadways clear and allow room for the plows to move through.
- Off Road vehicles including ATV's, 4-wheelers, and snowmobiles cannot be operated on the public streets, even if under a snow level or snow emergency.
- During snow/ice events village crews will be working diligently to ensure that roads are clear, please be patient as crews treat and plow the roadways.



Barnesville Ordinance Chapter 1371 requires that the owners and each adult occupant of all houses, apartments or other residences located within the Village of Barnesville shall post the street number of said house, apartment or other residence at some conspicuous place on the building or grounds. Said number shall be of sufficient size so as to be visible from the street. Anyone failing to comply may be fined a sum not exceeding fifty dollars (\$50.00). Each day of noncompliance may be considered a separate offense. Making sure your house numbers can be seen helps first responders find your location easier.

# **Barnesville PD Offers Webcheck**

The Barnesville Police Department is happy to announce we are now offering Electronic Fingerprinting Services. We have partnered with Fast Fingerprints to provide Webcheck services to our community. Cost for electronic background checks are BCI \$40, FBI \$52, or both (BCI & FBI) \$72.

In addition to Ohio BCI and FBI database checks we are also able to complete Florida Level 2 Background checks, Fingerprint Capture, and Fingerprint Cards.

Appointments are required and must be made online by visiting http://www.fastfingerprints.com. Current appointment times are Monday-Friday 9am-4pm, open holidays. Hours will be extended in the future.

# Belmont County Sheriff's Office

- No law enforcement agency will ever ask you for banking information over the phone or internet
- No law enforcement agency will ask you to get prepaid cards or cash to pay "fines" over the phone or internet
- Even if the phone number they call from seems to be from legitimate law enforcement it could be a scam! If you are being pressured for money, ask for their names, hang up and immediately call your local police department.
- If are being promised a large sum of money, but are being asked for money upfront to receive it.... be suspicious.
- If you are being pressured to give money and banking information to someone on the phone or internet, take the time to check it out. Talk with family, friends, and your local police. Don't let scammers steal your hard-earned money

# **Be Cautious of Scams**

Regularly, the Barnesville Police Department receives calls from the public wanting to report a scam or inquiring if something may be a scam. We want to remind the community to watch out for signs of a scam. Not only should you be watching out for yourself but watching out for vulnerable loved ones in your life. Ongoing scams that have been reported to the depatment include: IRS Scam, Warrant Scam, Money Card Scam, Romance Scam, as well as many others. There is a countless amount of scenarios that scammers can use to try and pry information out of you.

Always remember:

1. Never provide your personal or financial information to an unsolicited caller or email.

2. Scammers usually try to create a sense of urgency. Slow down to truly understand what is being requested and by whom.

3. Be suspicious of callers who demand immediate payment for any reason.

3. Never wire money or provide a stranger with debit or credit card numbers.


4. Verify, verify, verify!
