VILLAGE UPDATE

Spring is just around the corner and it will soon be mowing season so it is a good time for residents to clean up their properties. The annual cemetery clean-up will take place on March 15th so grave decorations need to be removed by that date or they will be disposed of and speaking of mowing the Village is looking for seasonal workers for mowing of all village owned properties with applications available at the Barnesville Water Department.

The Village is currently working with ODOT on the Tunnel & Trail Project. The Village has been awarded 2.8 million dollars for this project to provide drainage and a liner for the tunnel complete with lighting as well as wing walls for bank stabilization and a paved walkway from South Street to St. Rt. 147 along Railroad Street.

The Village has been awarded FEMA funding through ODNR Division of Dam Safety to repair the slip at the Rotary Lake at Barnesville Memorial Park and we are hopeful that project will be completed this summer.

Residents have been wondering why Reservoir # 1 on Cross Road by the Water Treatment Plant is so low. There is a leak in the dam and ODNR has requested that we dewater the Reservoir until we get it to the level that the leak will stop. This will give the Village time to have an engineer investigate the situation and design repairs.

The Barnesville Memorial Park will be coming alive with the arrival of warmer weather. Baseball will be starting in March and the swimming pool will be opening May 25th along with many other activities. The Independence Day celebration is scheduled for Saturday July 6th with a rain date of Saturday July 13th.

Barnesville Sidewalk Replacement Loan Progam



Barnesville Village Council is offering a loan program to residents in an effort to replace deteriorated sidewalks. The program offers zero percent loans to replace the walks that travel parallel with Village streets and will include curbs and driveway aprons. The village will select and pay the contractor and then send a monthly invoice to the property owner. All rules, regulations, and specifications of the village will be followed. Applicants must have not had any delinquent water bills over the past 24 months, unpaid Village Income taxes, or unpaid fines.

Spring Cleaning Reminders

Spring time is the perfect time to ensure your property is in shape and abiding by the property maintenance code chapter 1381. Property owners are reminded to adhere to this code. Every premises and structure shall be maintained in good repair and kept free of all nuisances, health, safety, and fire hazards, unsanitary conditions and abate the same. Buildings should be maintained to be weather and water tight and free of deterioration. Inoperable vehicles shall be stored within fully enclosed buildings or other locations not exposed to public



view, or shall be removed from the premises. Whoever violates this section will be served with a 30-day notice to abate.

Now is also a good time to ensure lawn care equipment is in working order. If you typically hire someone to mow for you, it is also a good time to check with them or find a company to mow your property. That way when the grass begins to grow, everything will be in order to keep your property and lawn in compliance.

Barnesville PD Cruisers Equipped with LifeVac

The Barnesville Police Department cruisers are now equipped with a life-saving tool called LifeVac, thanks to a grant from the South Central Power Company Foundation. LifeVac is a simple airway clearance device that can be used on adults and children, requires only seconds to use, and can be administered by anyone in a choking emergency. These devices are now placed in each cruiser of the police department and will be utilized during choking emergencies. The Police Department is thankful for the grant from South Central Power Company Foundation for providing us this life saving tool.



On Sunday, February 11, 2024 the Barnesville Fire and EMS conducted a training session on vehicle extrication. Drills such as these enable department personnel to remain agile and responsive when responding to a true emegency.





Barnesville residents, age 18 and older, with earned income are required to file a Village income tax return annually. The Village of Barnesville contracts with the Regional Income Tax Agency (R.I.T.A) to administer income tax collections. As with federal and state, the local tax deadline is Monday, April 15, 2024. Please submit your income tax return electronically by visiting www.ritaohio.com or by mailing your completed Form 37. Taxpayers that have moved outside the village limits or are retired receiving only retirement income, must notify RITA by completing an Individual Declaration of Exemption Form located at www.ritaohio.com.

Contractor & Building Permits Required

Completing a project this year? You may need to obtain a building permit with the Village. Any time you are building or remodeling commercial or residential property within the Village of Barnesville Corporation limit you must first obtain a building permit. This gives you legal permission form the Village to begin construction work or demolition. These permits must be obtained BEFORE your project can begin. Contractors are also required to obtain a permit with the Village prior to doing contractor work within the Village Corporation Limit. These permits can be obtained from the Fiscal Office at the Municipal Building, 132 N Arch St, Barnesville on the 2nd floor. Permit application forms can be found on the Village Website www.barnesvilleohio.com on the Fiscal Office page or by clicking on the forms button on the homepage. Along with the alert being posted onto the Village Facebook, Twitter, Village Website, and the CodeRED Mobile App.

Ohio Outdoor Fire Laws: What You Need to Know

Ohio Revised Code 1503.18 Regarding Kindled Fires

O.R.C. 1503.18 is under the authority of the Ohio Division of Forestry.

This law prohibits outdoor open burning statewide in unincorporated areas during the months of March, April, May, October, and November between the hours of 6 a.m. and 6 p.m.

This ban includes burning of yard waste, trash, and debris, even in a proper burn barrel.

During spring, wildfire danger is high before plants have turned green, and in fall, fire danger is high due to abundant dry leaves and dead grass. Warm, windy weather in both seasons also contribute to elevated fire risk. Always be sure to use a proper burn barrel when burning outdoors during legal hours.



Ground cleared down to mineral soil or gravel at least 10 feet on each side of incinerator

O.A.C. 3745.19 is enforced by the Ohio EPA EPA notification is required for many types of open burns in Ohio.

EPA Basics for Homeowners

Materials NEVER to be burned at any time or any place in Ohio:

- Food Waste
- Dead Animals
- Materials containing rubber, grease, asphalt, or made from petroleum


OTHER RESTRICTIONS:

- Fires must be more than 1,000 feet from neighbor's inhabited building
- No burning when air pollution alert, warning, or emergency is in effect
- Fire/smoke cannot obscure visibility on roadway, railways, or airfields
- No waste generated off the premises may be burned
- No burning within village or city limits or restricted areas

Barnesville Police Awarded Grant For AED Machines

The Barnesville Police Department recently was awarded \$5,280.00 from the Belmont County Enrichment Fund through the Community Foundation for the Ohio Valley to purchase Automated External Defibrillators (AED) Machines for the patrol cruisers to better response to sudden cardiac arrest calls. AED machines are portable devices that can deliver an electric shock through the chest to the heart when it detects abnormal rhythm and changes the rhythm back to normal. AEDs help those who are having sudden cardiac arrest, which occurs suddenly when the heart stop beating regularly. AEDs can reduce the risk of death from a cardiac arrest event to help restore the hearts rhythm.

Ohio Total Solar Eclipse

On Monday, April 8, 2024 a total solar eclipse will cross North America, passing over Mexico, the United States, and Canada. On this date, people within 124-mile wide band in the State of Ohio will experience a total solar eclipse. This will be an exciting celestial event and we want all to enjoy the day safely.

Areas in Ohio that are outside of the path of totality will experience a partial eclipse. Barnesville is outside of the path but will experience 97% totality. A total solar eclipse is a rare spectacular event. On average, one happens somewhere on the Earth only once every 1.5 years. Only 21 total solar eclipses have crossed the lower 48 states in the entire existence of the United States.

The last total solar eclipse visible in Ohio was in 1806. The next total solar eclipse for Ohio is the year 2099.

A solar eclipse occurs when the moon casts its shadow on the Earth as it passes between the Earth and the Sun. A total solar eclipse occurs when the moon appears to totally obscure the Sun.

Safety is the number one priority when viewing a total solar eclipse. It's never safe to look directly at the sun's rays, even if the sun is partially obscured. The only safe way to look directly at a partially eclipsed sun is through special-purpose solar filters, such as eclipse glasses or hand-held solar viewers. Be sure you're familiar with solar eclipse safety tips.

HOW TO VIEW A SOLAR ECLIPSE SAFELY

A total solar eclipse occurs when the moon completely blocks the sun's bright face, also known as totality, and day momentarily turns into night.



The only safe way to look directly at the sun during an eclipse is through special-purpose solar filters, like eclipse glasses or handheld solar viewers.



The only safe time to look at the sun without solar filters is during the 2-4 minutes of total eclipse. It is never safe to look at the sun without solar filters during any other phases of the eclipse.

TOTAL ECLIPSE OF THE HEART OF IT ALL



HERE ARE SOME TIPS FOR SAFELY VIEWING THE ECLIPSE:

- Only look at the eclipse through a special-purpose solar filter. Safe eclipse glasses should comply with ISO 12312-2 international standard.
- Homemade filters or ordinary sunglasses, even very dark ones, are unsafe. They transmit too much sunlight and could damage the eyes.
- Inspect your solar filter; discard if scratched or damaged.
 Follow any instructions for the filter.
- Always supervise children using solar filters.
- Stand still, cover your eyes with your eclipse glasses or solar viewer before looking at the sun. Afterward, turn away before removing your filter — never remove it while looking at the sun.
- Do not look at the uneclipsed or partially eclipsed sun through an unfiltered camera, telescope, binoculars, or other optical device.
 - Similarly, do not look at the sun through a camera, a telescope, binoculars, or any other optical device while using your eclipse glasses or hand-held solar viewer the concentrated solar rays will damage the filter and enter your eye(s), causing serious injury.
 - Seek expert advice before using a solar filter with a camera, a telescope, binoculars, or any other optical device. Note that solar filters must be attached to the front of any telescope, binoculars, camera lens, or other optics.
