Downtown Street Sweep No Parking Fridays

Residents & visitors are reminded that there is no parking Friday morning between 3:00 AM - 7:00 AM on North Arch St from Church St to East Main, East Main Street from the Square to Henderson St, West Main St from Square to Gardner St, North Chestnut St from Square to Cherry St, and South Chestnut St from Square to Mill St.

Fire Hydrant Flushing

The Barnesville Water Department will be flushing fire hydrants beginning during summer months and will continue daily until completed. Residents may experience loss of pressure and discolored water and should inspect the water prior to washing clothing as staining may result. The Barnesville Water Department aplogizes for any inconveniences this may create.

Historical Solar Events Over Barnesville

The months of April and May marked a couple of historical solar events for Barnesville and the sourrounding areas. April 8, 2024 we got to witness the Solar Eclipse take place above us. This solar eclipse was deemed to be a once-in-a-lifetime event. The next total solar eclipse will be in 2044. Then May 10-12, 2024 due to a powerful geomagnetic solar storm the Aurora Borealis (Northern Lights) were viewable across our night skys above Barnesville and throughout the area. This rare spectical for our area has been deemed the most impressive solar storm in decades. There is a chance in the future for them to be viewable once again. The next astronomical event will be the partial Lunar Eclipse on September 18, 2024 and a Total Lunar eclipse on March 14, 2025.






Pictured above is the Aurora Borealis over Barnesville from May 11, 2024. Pictured to the left is the Solar Eclipse from April 8, 2024.



Permit Parking Spaces Available - East Main Lot

The Village of Barnesville has several permit parking spaces available in the East Main Street Parking Lot, located between Cheffy's and Avenues of Barnesville. The cost is \$20 a month or \$120 a year. Parking permits are valid Monday through Saturday 8am-6pm, except special events and for maintenance. Permits are sold on a first come basis. Make sure your house number can be seen from the road.

Clearly display your house number so emergency responders can quickly find you. Barnesville Ordinance Chapter 1371 requires that the owners and each adult occupant of all houses, apartments or other residences located within the Village of Barnesville shall post the street number of said house, apartment or other residence at some conspicuous place on the building or grounds. Said number shall be of sufficient size so as to be visible from the street. Anyone failing to comply may be fined a sum not exceeding fifty dollars (\$50.00). Each day of noncompliance may be considered a separate offense. Making sure your house numbers can be seen helps first responders find your location easier.

Signs throughout the 2-hour parking area have been posted reminding those who park there consent to the enforcment of time limits, including the chalking of tires and other enforement means.

Reminder: Parking Time Limits

Residents, business owners, their employees, and visitors are reminded of downtown parking restrictions. Downtown parking is 2 hour parking 9am-5pm on any day except on Sundays and legal holidays, unless otherwise marked. (ORD 351.14 passed 12-07-81).

2 Hour Parking Areas Includes (unless otherwise posted):

- East Main Street from S Lincoln to Chestnut St (Square)
- · West Main St from Chestnut St (Square) to Gardner St
- North Chestnut St from Walnut St to Main St (Square)
- · South Chestnut St from Main St (Square) to South St

Additional Parking Restrictions:

- First two spaces on North Arch St near East Church St are 15-min parking from 9am-5pm on any day except Sundays and legal holidays.
- · North Arch St Handicap spot in front of the Municipal Building is 30-min parking
- In order to facilitate vehicular access to and from the Barnesville Elementary School, parking on West Church Street between North Chestnut Street and North Broadway St and also on North Gardner Street between West Main St and West Church St is probibitted on School Days between the hours of 7am-4pm. (ORD 351.17 passed 12-10-18)
- Please pay attention to no parking areas and loading zones throughout downtown.
- No parking Fridays between 3am-7am (Street Sweep Day) on North Arch St from Church St to East Main St, East Main St from square to Henderson St, West Main St from square to Garnder St, North Chestnut St from Square to Cherry St, and South Chestnut St from Square to Mill St.

Other Parking Reminders:

- Street parking is public parking and is first come, first serve. Residents are not entitled to parking spaces out front of their homes on the public street.
- Objects cannot be placed in the roadway to block a parking space.
- No Parking on the Sidwalk please do not block the sidewalk.
- Parking in a handicap space, you must have a valid handicap placard that must be displayed at all times while parking in the handicap spot.
- The Village has parking permits available for the East Main Street Lot (between Cheffy's and Avenues of Barnesville) for those to purchase that wish to have reserved parking and a guaranteed space.



351.13: NIGHT PARKING OF COMMERCIAL VEHICLES.

(a) No person shall park a school bus, commercial tractor, agricultural tractor, truck of more than one and one-half ton capacity, bus, trailer, semitrailer, pole trailer or moving van on any street within the Municipality between 6:00 p.m. and 4:00 a.m.

(b) This section shall not apply to commercial vehicles while being loaded or unloaded.

(c) Except as otherwise provided in this subsection, whoever violates this section is guilty of a minor misdemeanor. If, within one year of the offense, the offender previously has been convicted of or pleaded guilty to one predicate motor vehicle or traffic offense, whoever violates this section is guilty of a misdemeanor of the fourth degree. If, within one year of the offense, the offender previously has been convicted of two or more predicate motor vehicle or traffic offenses, whoever violates this section is guilty of a misdemeanor of the third degree.

ORD 505.01 Dogs and Other Animals Running at Large.

No owner can allow a dog to run at large. All dogs must be on a leash when they are being walked. Dogs must be under the reasonable control of some persons.



ORD 505.09 Barking or Howling Dogs.

No person shall keep or harbor any dog within the Municipality which, by frequent and habitual barking, howling or yelping, creates unreasonably loud and disturbing noises of such a character, intensity and duration as to disturb the peace, quiet and good order of the Municipality.

Please Clean Up After Your Pet.

A dog owner shall be responsible for the immediate removal and proper disposal of his/her dog's feces. Proper disposal shall consist of placing the feces in a wrapper and using a trash receptacle.

Ohio Outdoor Fire Laws: What You Need to Know

Ohio Revised Code 1503.18 Regarding Kindled Fires

O.R.C. 1503.18 is under the authority of the Ohio Division of Forestry.

This law prohibits outdoor open burning statewide in unincorporated areas during the months of March, April, May, October, and November between the hours of 6 a.m. and 6 p.m.

This ban includes burning of yard waste, trash, and debris, even in a proper burn barrel.

During spring, wildfire danger is high before plants have turned green, and in fall, fire danger is high due to abundant dry leaves and dead grass. Warm, windy weather in both seasons also contribute to elevated fire risk. Always be sure to use a proper burn barrel when burning outdoors during legal hours.



Ground cleared down to mineral soil or gravel at least 10 feet on each side of incinerator

EPA Basics for Homeowners

Materials NEVER to be burned at any time or any place in Ohio:

- Food Waste
- Dead Animals
- Materials containing rubber, grease, asphalt, or made from petroleum

OTHER RESTRICTIONS:

- Fires must be more than 1,000 feet from neighbor's inhabited building
- No burning when air pollution alert, warning, or emergency is in effect
- Fire/smoke cannot obscure visibility on roadway, railways, or airfields
- No waste generated off the premises may be burned
- No burning within village or city limits or restricted areas

Contractor & Building Permits Required

Completing a project this year? You may need to obtain a building permit with the Village. Any time you are building or remodeling commercial or residential property within the Village of Barnesville Corporation limit you must first obtain a building permit. This gives you legal permission form the Village to begin construction work or demolition.

These permits must be obtained BEFORE your project can begin. Contractors are also required to obtain a permit with the Village prior to doing contractor work within the Village Corporation Limit. These permits can be obtained from the Fiscal Office at the Municipal Building, 132 N Arch St, Barnesville on the 2nd floor. Permit application forms can be found on the Village Website www.barnesvilleohio.com on the Fiscal Office page or by clicking on the forms button on the homepage. If you have any questions about building or contractor permits you may contact the Fiscal Office 740-425-3444.




MAINTENANCE OF PREMESIS: Each and every premesis shall be kept free of all nuisances, health, safety, and fire hazards, unsanitary conditions, and infestation. It shall be the duty of the responsible party to keep the premesis free of said conditions and

to promptly remove and abate the same.

TRASH, JUNK, DEBRIS: Such items are prohibitted from being left on your property for extended periods of time. They must be properly disposed of.

VEHICLES: Must have current & updated

registration and tags. Must be egguipped with all parts required to legally operate safetly on the roadway.

Properties that are in violation of the Village Property Maintenance Code 1381 are given a notice to abate. This notice provides the property owner 30-days to correct the violation. After 30-days property owners will be summonsed to appear in Mayor's Court and may be penalized \$100 per day for each day the violation(s) continue after the abatement has expired.

Violations can be reported to the Barnesville Police Department at 740-425-1976, Barnesville Fire Department 740-425-3054, or you may report violations online by visiting www.barnesvilleohio.com and going to "Report A Concern."

As of May 28, 2024, the village has served or mailed 57 abatement notices for property issues so far. The Village continues to work on property maintenance violations.

Golf Cart Reminders

During the Summer months we tend to see an increase useage of Golf Cart Operations within the Village. We would like to remind residents of the rules/laws of operating golf carts within the Village of Barnesville

Corporation Limits:



- Drivers/Operators of a golf cart must have a VALID driver's license.
- No person less than 16 years of age should operate a golf cart.
- No person shall operate a golf cart on the street within the Village of Barnesville unless the golf cart has been inspected.
- · Do not drink and drive.
- Must obey ALL traffic laws during operation (No U-Turns).
- No person shall operate a golf cart on any public roadway that is 35 MPH or greater except when crossing such roadway. Crossing means from one side, directly to the other side. (Point A to Point B)
- Occupants of a golf cart should be seated at all times on the seat.
 Standing on the golf cart while in motion is prohibited.
- ALL occupants of the golf cart should be buckled up using a seat belt.
- Child safety seat is required for any occupant under the age of four (4) or under forty (40) pounds in weight.
- Golf carts are not permitted to be driven on the sidewalk.
- Operation of a golf cart is permitted year round.

Inspection Information & Requirements

No person shall operate a golf cart on the streets within the Village unless the golf cart has been inspected for compliance with the State of Ohio statutory reqirements that are applicable to motor vehicles and the Codified Ordinances of the Village entitling the owner or operator to secure a title and license for the golf cart. A \$50 inspection fee is due at time of inspection. Below is a listing of requiremets for Golf Carts:

- · Valid Driver's License

- Must be equipped with two brake lights, visible from a distance of 500 feet
- Must have two working headlights capable of illuminating person or objects at a distance of at least 75 feet
- Must have a working horn, audible form not less than 200 feet
- Must have a rearview mirror
- · Must have Windshield (Plexi glass or safety glass)
- · Must have working direcitonal (turn) signals
- Must have bracket for mounting rear license plate
- · Seat belts required for each occupant

Happy Retirement John Fuchs!


