#### **Christmas Tree Pickup**

#### Annual CodeRED Test March 1, 2025 at 1 PM

The Village of Barnesville will be sending out the annual test of the emergency alert system CodeRED on Saturday, March 1, 2025 at 1:00 PM. Subscribers will receive a test alert by phone call, text, and email. This allows us to ensure the system is operational. Like last year, an optional survey will be conducted once the test is completed. To register or update your registry for CodeRED visit www.alerts.barnesvilleohio.com.

#### Permit Spaces Available - East Main Parking Lot

The Village of Barnesville has several permit parking spaces available in the East Main Street Parking Lot, located between Cheffy's and Avenues of Barnesville. The cost is \$20 a month or \$120 a year. Parking permits are valid Monday through Saturday 8am-6pm, except special events and for maintenance. Permits are sold on a first come basis. For more information or to purchase a permit, contact the Barnesville Police Department 740-425-1976.

#### **Fall Leaf Pickup**

The Barnesville Public Works will be picking up leafs that are left curbside by residents of the Village of Barnesville as long as they are contained in paper biodegradable compostable bags. No plastic trash bags will be accepted. Bags must contain leaves only and will be picked up as time allows. No specific schedule will be followed. Collection will begin October 21st , 2024 and end December 16th, 2024. Also there is no longer a drop off point at the Depot and will be a dumping violation if found dropping off there.

# **※ Winter Has Arrived ※**

- Please do not shovel or plow snow into the roadway or onto neighboring properties without permission from the property owner.
- Sidewalks must be kept free of snow and ice.

  Please do your part and remember to shovel your sidewalks this winter. Property owners are responsible for the maintenance and upkeep of their sidewalks during the winter and year round.
- Use caution when driving during snowfall and this winter as roads could be slick. Always remember your headlights during rain, snow & fog to create better visibility.
- No parking in the downtown area if snowfall exceeds three inches or greater, to allow for the downtown streets to be plowed.

- Do not leave your vehicle running unattended with keys inside it to heat up. Doing so creates the perfect opportunity for the vehicle to be stolen.
- Do your part and help public works by keeping the roadways clear and allow room for the plows to move through.
- Off Road vehicles including ATV's, 4-wheelers, and snowmobiles cannot be operated on the public streets, even if under a snow level or snow emergency.
- During snow/ice events village crews will be working diligently to ensure that roads are clear, please be patient as crews treat and plow the roadways.

# CodeRED° Emergency Alert Test MARCH 1, 2025 @ 1:00 PM

The Village of Barnesville will be sending out a test Emergency Alert through CodeRED. Subscribers will receive a test alert by phone call, text, and email. This allows us to ensure the system is operational.

#### Barnesville to Test the CodeRED Community Notification System

The Village of Barnesville Emergency Notification System, CodeRED, will be tested on Saturday, March 1, 2025 at approximately 1:00 PM to validate telephone numbers in the CodeRED database system. The CodeRED system is provided to Barnesville through Belmont County 911. Here's what you need to know:

- There is no need to take action if you receive the call. Emergency personnel
  are merely testing the system to ensure it is operational as needed, and to
  encourage additional residents to enroll to receive future notifications.
- This process helps us continually improve the system. Testing increases the
  efficiency of the system and speed at which notifications will be delivered during
  an actual emergency.
- Visit our website to update contact information. If your phone number is not in the database, you will not receive a call when we do launch an important notification.

Residents and businesses are encouraged to visit our website and update their contact information, in particular those individuals who have unlisted phone numbers, who have changed their phone number or address within the past year and those who use a cellular phone or VoIP phone as their primary number. The more residents who actively add or update their contact information in the emergency database, the better able we are to protect people and property.

The CodeRED system allows the Village of Barnesville and Belmont County officials to effectively reach residents and personnel by using the system's capabilities to send telephone calls, text messages, emails and social media posts to inform residents and better protect life and property.

BARNESVILLE ORDINANCE HIGHLIGHT & REMINDERS

#### 521.06 DUTY TO KEEP SIDEWALKS IN REPAIR AND CLEAN.


- (a) No owner or occupant of abutting lands shall fail to keep the sidewalks, curbs or gutters in repair and free from snow, ice or any nuisance. (ORC 723.011)
- (b) Whoever violates this section is guilty of a minor misdemeanor.

#### 509.09 EXCESSIVE NOISE PROHIBITED.

- (a) No person shall make, continue, or cause any loud, unnecessary or unusual noise or any noise which either annoys, disturbs, injures or endangers the comfort, repose, health, peace or safety of others, within the Village limits.
- (b) The following act is declared to be a loud, disturbing and unnecessary noise in violation of this ordinance, but said enumeration shall not be deemed to be exclusive, namely: The discharge into open air of the exhaust of any steam engine, internal combustion engine, or motor vehicle except through a muffler or other device which will effectively prevent loud or explosive noises therefrom. (Ord. 1412. Passed 3-15-76.)
- (c) Whoever violates this section is guilty of a minor misdemeanor.

## Tips to AVOID FROZEN PIPES

#### **Before the Cold** Sets In:

- · Eliminate sources of cold air near water lines. Seal any cracks or openings around windows and
- · Know how to shut off your water in the case of an emergency.
- Protect your pipes by wrappign them with insulation.
- · Remove, drain and store garden hoses.

#### **When Temperatures Stay Below Freezing:**

- Keep the heat in your home at a minimum of 55 degrees.
- If pipes run through cabinets, open the doors to let warmer room temperatures flow in.
- Allow faucets to drip.

#### **If your Pipes** Do Freeze:

- Shut off the water immediately.
- Thaw pipes with a hair dryer or a space heater. Do not leave space heater unattended and do not use kerosene heaters or open flames.
- Be careful turning the water back on. Once pipes are thawed, slowly turn the water back on and check pipes and joints for any cracks or leaks.


Half of all home heating fires occur in December, January and February.



Heating equipment is involved in 1 in every 6 home fires and 1 in every 5 home fire deaths.



Keep anything that can burn at least 3 feet from any heat source like fireplaces, wood stoves, radiators or space heaters.

#### **Boil Water For:**



- Drinking
- · Brushing teeth
- Washing fruits & vegetables
- Preparing food
- Mixing baby formula
- Making ice
- Giving water to pets
- · Coffee makers
- Dish washing by hand, rinsing with bottled, boiled or chlorinated water

#### **Use Caution:**



- Water filters in most kitchens and households Do NOT remove bacteria or viruses
- Bathing babies and young children (give sponge bath; use boiled water that has cooled)

#### DO NOT Need to Boil Water For:



- Washing clothes in washing machine (Use Caution as staining could occur)
- Taking showers (adults & older children;do NOT drink water)
- · Flushing toilets
- Car washing
- Household cleaning
- Dishwasher with a Sanitizing cycle (this will bring the temperature high enough to destroy bacteria if present)

# HOW TO BOIL WATER DURING A BOIL WATER ADVISORY





Heat the water until bubbles come from the bottom of the pot to the top.



Once the water reaches a rolling boil, let it boil for 1 minute.



Turn off the heat source and let the water cool.



Pour the water ito a clean container with a cover for storage.

The Barnesville Police Department offers electronic fingerprinting services, providing enhanced convenience for local residents and businesses. The department offers fingerprinting services from 9:00 AM to 5:30 PM, Monday through Friday. Other hours may be requested by calling 740-425-1976.

#### **Available Services:**

- Ohio BCI and FBI Database Webchecks: Secure checks for various purposes, including employment and licensing.
- Florida Level 2 Background Checks: Comprehensive background screenings required for certain Florida-related clearances.
- Fingerprint Capture: High-quality electronic capture of fingerprints.
- Fingerprint Cards: Physical fingerprint cards for applications and records.

Appointments are required and can be scheduled online via Fast Fingerprints website by visiting www.fastfingerprints.com. Businesses and Organizations that may prefer to be billed for Fingerprinting Services must complete a Direct Bill Client Application or call 1-877-932-2435 to set up a direct bill account.


