b. Mayor Hershberger and Council discussed Resolution #4011-To Amend the Agreement with CTI Engineers, Inc. for the Wastewater Treatment Plant Improvements Project. Mayor Hershberger confirmed with CTI that construction costs would only incur if and when we go into construction and there is no set timeframe in the Agreement. We could leave the Agreement as written or separate the costs. Mayor Hershberger added that we are amending the scope of work and updating the cost estimates to start the grant process.

Councilman Brad Hudson asked Roger Deal Village Administrator to review the Agreement and compare it to the original one.

Richard Myser Village Solicitor provided the second reading of Resolution #4011-To Amend an Agreement with CTI Engineers, Inc., to Provide Services Pertaining to the Wastewater Treatment Plant Improvements Project.


